

Thoughts on the beginning

Superbly hooked at the beginning. The quick cutting and progression of the narrative was engaging. The film looks beautiful, we are introduced to the characters well and you give the audience a sense of drama. After the first few sequences the pacing then drops off.

Thoughts on the middle

The middle of this film shows some very interesting elements of the local culture and experiences which the protagonist has become involved with. It demonstrates that the character is growing and developing as a result of the plot.

Thoughts on the end

The end of this film is slightly predictable but still gives the audience a sense of resolution.

Immediate areas for improvement

Sometimes the music is cheesy and overbearing. The piece had it's own charm and personality, but some of the cut is quite disjointed. You need to find an economy to your storytelling. You use quite a few cuts to tell certain sections of the story.

The pace of your narrative would've benefited significantly if you get rid of everything unecessary.

What can be done right away

Please keep on making films. You are clearly very talented. Learn lessons from your mistakes, and don't let ego stand in your way. Best of luck with your continued career.

Final thoughts on reflection (after 2 days away from the work)

There is a beautiful and moving story at the heart of the film. The cinematography is the stand out feature as many of the shots are beautifully captured I would suggest that the pacing is altered slightly.
